

The Economic Outlook.

- ✓ Situation has been difficult for business and individuals since Hurricane Ian.
- ✓ Real estate sales slowing, but price of single-family homes continued to rise, increasing 6% to 29% year-on-year.
- ✓Low inventory, and more moving to the area keeping prices steady.
- √Just under 1,000 moving to the state each day!



The Economic Outlook.

- ✓ Florida is one of the most powerful economic forces in the country, with a GDP of \$1 trillion and one of the most diverse economies.
 - √No state income tax.
 - √Sales tax approx. 7%
 - √Corporate rate tax 5.5%
 - √Ranked No. 4 for best business tax climate



The Economic Outlook.

- √Unemployment 3.4% at end of 2022.
- ✓ Airport passenger activity increased 9% between Nov and Dec 2022 but was still 12% below 2021 levels.
- ✓Tourist tax revenues were down 25% between Nov 22 and Nov 21.
- ✓ Seasonally-adjusted taxable sales were up 9% over Nov 2021 possibly due to many people having to replace cars, white goods, food items, and building materials after lan's wrath.

- Workforce Housing Not the same as affordable housing or what used to be called Public Housing.
- Middle Income workers: Police, Fire, Healthcare, Retail, etc.
- Many examples of procedures that have been used in towns and cities in the USA and Canada were referenced in the recent Engage Estero article. www.esterotoday.com
- Toronto has in 2022, initiated -condominium projects with 100 or more units must set aside 5-10% for affordable rental and ownership. By 2030, that number will increase to 8-22%.



- New Initiative from FL Senate President Kathleen Passidomo:
- ❖ Bill is set for the 2023 Regular Session, starting March 7.
- ❖ Passidomo has tapped Sen. Alexis Calatayud, a Miami Republican, to sponsor SB 102, a wide-ranging, 93-page bill heavy on incentives for developers, landlords and local governments to build or refurbish affordable housing units, lower rent and waive zoning requirements that prevent affordable housing units from being built.



- ❖ Developments built in the last five years with at least 70 units that offer rents at least 10% below the local market rate would be exempt from property tax for each unit set aside for middle-income families.
- Another program would allow cities and counties to offer property tax exemptions to developers who dedicate units for affordable housing to households earning 50% of the local median income.



- ❖ Overall, the bill sets aside \$259 million for State Apartment Incentive Loan (SAIL) and \$252 million for the State Housing Initiative Partnership (SHIP), which provides grants to local governments to create and preserve affordable housing.





OVERVIEW

- > Total 1631 homes/lots affected
- ➤ Installation of county sewer and potable water
 - ➤ Phase I
 - Estero Bay Village, Cypress Bend, and Sunny Groves (package plants)
 - > 820 homes/lots = 50%
 - ➤ Phase II
 - Broadway West (Estero River Heights & Quarterdeck Cove), Charing Cross, Sherrill & Luettich
 - ➤ 322 homes/lots = 70% total
- ➤ Banks Engineering Study
 - ➤ October 2020
 - >~\$40.5M



- Proposed \$350 million that will be allotted to hurricane impacted areas in southwest Florida.




Wildlife Crossing (representative)

"...there will be a wildlife crossing under Alico in this same wetland system (see below in blue, the current crossing for Corkscrew is in red). This will also be dual bridges but larger than that on Corkscrew Rd. There will be a drainage channel in the middle with raised "shelfs" on either side for the animals to traverse. I believe there are large box culverts within Wildblue for animal crossing purposes as well."


